



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I. WHO WE ARE

THE ASSOCIATION FOR A UNITED COMMUNITY AND SOCIAL INTERVENTION- ACSIS is a non-governmental organization, non-profit, without any political or religious character, which develops programs meant to maintain the cohesion of the most vulnerable families, starting 2004.

ACSIS MISSION is to keep the children in their original family by offering psycho-social services to parents or future parents who are in difficulties.

We do this by supporting the parents to:

- overcome major challenges in the prenatal and postnatal periods, material, financial difficulties and the lack of useful information regarding the child's need and the importance of his/her first years of life.
- to develop their self-confidence and to reach goals such as finishing their studies, finding a job, avoiding an unwanted pregnancy.

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Our VISION is a world in which :

- each child benefits of a correct care, corresponding to his/her needs.
- each parent or future parent has the right knowledge about the child's care, about the importance of the psychological aspects in the children's development and education.
- each parent in difficulties benefits of professional support in the raise and care of his/her child or children.



Values which we believe in:

Responsibility: We help parents make responsible choices for their children's future.

Continuous education: We support the parents to offer their children the necessary education.

Uniqueness: Each parent is unique, same as each child is unique. Each problem has the appropriate solving and approach.

Solidarity: Each help matters! We involve the community in solving the situation of the children in difficulties.

We leave behind a year full of challenges but of learnt lessons, as well: looking at the difficulties as opportunities, we have managed, through common efforts, to cope with some increased needs having limited resources.

This year we understood that, in order to help in a sustainable way the children in difficulties we need to help their families to find benchmarks and solutions, which brings a positive and long-term change in their life. In most of the cases this thing meant identifying or building opportunities for a new way of life, which brings trust and dignity at the same time with the necessary income for sustaining the family.

We believe that the most appropriate place which any child deserves to live in, is within the biological family. We know, in a direct way, that an appropriate help offered to a family in a difficult moment can change the children's course of life, can transform lives and this is the reason why we remain faithful to our mission, even in the toughest moments. These children cannot wait for better times. We are grateful that we were able to be present, this year as well, where the need for our support was the highest.

We succeeded in bringing an additional hope in the life of families we were working with, through specially adjusted workshops on the subject of human traffic prevention.

Single mothers with a low level of education and desperate to find a work place in order to sustain their children, often become victims of this phenomenon, with their children also being at risk. We have also paid attention to the teenagers coming from dysfunctional families and socially disadvantaged environments, going ahead with the information activities of the groups from the vocational schools in Bucharest.

The activities dimension of the organization can be seen in the next pages but the quantification shows only a part of what our work means.

The soothing of some scared children, on the verge of being abandoned, the regained self-confidence of some mothers who were at the limit of the despair because of the impossibility to raise their own children next to them, and the huge efforts of a team of dedicated people who brought solutions to reestablish the balance for each family, are realities and uncountable accomplishments which are for us, the most important results.

We would like to thank everybody who has joined us this year: donors, sponsors, volunteers and partners. Our accomplishments wouldn't have been possible without your support!

III. PROJECTS AND RESULTS 2012

1. INTEGRATED SERVICES TO PREVENT THE SEPARATION OF THE CHILD FROM SINGLE - PARENT AND DISADVANTAGED FAMILIES



More than 760 children have been abandoned, in our country, within the first 6 months of 2012, according to the Direction for Child Protection within MMFPS.

The figures show that in the first part of the year 2012 there has been an increase of 10% of abandoned cases in hospitals compared to the same period in 2011.

More and more families are in the situation of abandoning their children due to extreme poverty, the low level of education, the bad living conditions, the decrease of the financial compensation offered by the government for sustaining the family.

Through its main objective, that of maintaining the children within the natural families, the project contributes to the decrease of the number of children in institutions and fights against the causes of bringing them in such institutions.

We address, through the activities and the delivered services, the main causes of abandonment : poverty, the low level of parents' education, the difficulties in accessing the job market for the underprivileged people.

Through direct and individualized assistance, adjusted to the needs of each family, identified following the evaluations and the personalized counseling plans, we supported, in 2012, a number of 148 children found at risk of abandon.

The ways of supporting have been very diverse, including: material support, financial, hygienic products and articles necessary for babies care, clothes, footwear, materials for school, covering the rental costs for a determined period in order to avoid the eviction from the house, the payment of certain medical analysis. Through the offered social services such as psycho-social counseling, vocational counseling and support in finding and keeping a work place, we have aimed at responding to the children's needs of nurture and safety, of emotional re-balance and the self-confidence increase of the beneficiary mothers, of the awareness of their capacity to influence their own lives. We have also supported the families in obtaining the social compensations offered by the government and in accessing the educational services for children (kindergartens, schools, day care centers).

The team has agreed with each mother upon a professional road and based on their abilities and professional competencies there has been a search for specialized courses in domains such as: commerce, textiles,



pastry or for working places, the assistance period being limited in time and aiming at developing the mother's ability to take responsibilities for herself and for the child through attaining emotional and financial independence.

148 children remained at home, next to their mothers, thanks to our actions to prevent the separation of children from their family.

76 single mothers have benefited from psycho-social counseling, vocational counseling and material/financial support.

25 mothers have got and kept a working place and maintain themselves with their own resources, following the sustained assistance of our team.

38 children have been integrated in an educational form (nursery school, kindergarten, school, day care center).

12 mothers have benefited from our support and followed qualification courses or continued/ started school again.

31 mothers have improved/ have reconciled with the original family or with the partner.

35 mothers have been supported in accessing the services of our partners in order to overcome some additional problems to those approached by us (e.g. hosting, medical care, schooling, qualification, mental health, HIV, domestic violence, others).

RESULTS

The children we assist are common children: they laugh when they are happy, they cry when they are sad, they need a mother and a father to love and protect them. They are fragile and they have a captivating inner world, full of dreamlike characters: dragons, witches, soldiers and small and helpless victims. Some of them dream of princesses and princes- rarely, unfortunately.




The children that we help have witnessed violence have suffered emotional and physical abuses and have lived the worst nightmare that a child could live: they were on the verge of being abandoned and they remember this well.

Their scars are on the inside and so are their mothers': alone, terrified, often very young, rejected by their families, they too have been subjected to abuse.

EVENTS

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Each year, within the events which have already become a tradition and in which we celebrate them, we meet children that Santa Claus has never reached and children who have never seen a playground. We have organized surprise-parties for them at the Kid's Dream playground. The children received sweets and gifts and they enchanted us with songs and poems and we all turned ourselves into children for a few moments !

BE SANTA CLAUS FOR ONE OF THE CHILDREN AT ACSIS!

The month of November has started with the mobilization of all our friends- from the social network and not only- who have become Santa's most helpful aid. We have been glad to see that only after our first call to action on Facebook, we have started to receive, at our premises, gifts for the children who were not waiting for Santa this year: toys, clothes, many care products and, of course, the sweets. Our friends and the children's friends probably do not realize the difference that their gesture has made in the life of these small children but we have witnessed their happiness and on behalf of them, we thank you!

Monica, a 29 years old single mother with two children, came to ACSIS when she was in a desperate situation: no incomes, no family to ask for support, with the responsibility of feeding and taking care of two little children (a 6 months baby girl and a 4 years old baby boy) and on the verge of being evacuated by the owner because she didn't have the money to pay the rent. Her husband and father of the two children left home immediately after the baby girl was born and the connection between them stopped at that moment. Without knowing the reason why she was left by the man she was trusting and she was counting on, without any solutions to the difficult situation she was in, Monica confessed that she was at the end of her powers. Nevertheless, what she wanted was to be hired and to sustain her children.

At the first meeting with us, the mother was confused, she was talking only a bit, her eyes looking down, she was afraid and agitated. The relationship with the children was influenced by her sufferings: both children were sad but they were looking for eye contact with us and their mother. Petre did not want to play, the insecurity and the fear of abandon being so high that he did not want to leave the place next to his mother in any way. Maria -who was only 6 months old- was friendly and playful but irritated by the lack of milk and a clean dipper. The three of them were dirty, having access to water only through some kind neighbors and they were definitely missing the appropriate clothes for that season.

Observing, during a complex evaluation, the severe and urgent situation in which Monica was at that moment (the children had not eaten since the day before, including the 6 months old girl), she has been immediately provided food which was enough for few days for both her children and herself. Following a later evaluation of the socio-economical and psychological situation of the family, the decision to place her in the project of preventing the separation of the child from the family deployed by ACSIS has been taken.

Through the assistance contract signed by Monica, it has been decided that she took part in the psychological, vocational and social counseling meetings, in the support and information groups, her family also receiving a monthly financial and material aid. The psychological intervention plan has aimed, in the first stage, at offering emotional support and reinforcing the self-confidence that she can have control over the events that influence her life, the final scope being the family autonomy.



In parallel with the psychological assistance which has been offered to her, the mother has been informed regarding her rights and all the necessary steps for her to get the children allowance have been made. DGASPC representatives have been contacted in order to mediate the enrollment of the children to the nursery school and the kindergarten.

Making rapid strides, Monica starts to change her life. She takes part at the social, psychological and vocational counselling meetings and at the support groups. Her availability for her children has increased, she improved her ability to raise and take care of them and she started to build friendship relationships with her peers, being more confident in her forces and in her future.

Together with her we have managed to find a place in the nursery school and in the kindergarten for the two children; we have identified a working place and a better house, at a price which the mother could afford even after she would be off the assistance. Monica has been made aware regarding the possibility of solving, step by step, the situation in which she is and, at the same time, having our support.



“I have turned to ACSIS Association because I had no income and I was in great need of help. At the moment, with the Association help, I work in the cleaning field at an attorney cabinet and I have started to do well and I feel much more peaceful inside. I thought I would never be able to recover from the situation I was in” .

2. PROJECT - THE CREATION WORKSHOP

More than one out of four children in Romania lives in a family which is under the national threshold for poverty (UNICEF 2012).

The families which are composed of only one parent are more vulnerable to the risk of poverty and to keeping this poverty than the traditional families.



The creation workshop is a social enterprise tightly bound to the organization mission, through which we offer an organized and secure working, learning and socializing environment for the mothers who raise their children alone, so that they can remain together.

The low level in professional qualification and the lack of help in raising and taking care of the children are the main reasons why the single mothers, with difficult social and financial situations, cannot find and keep a working place.

We create opportunities for the mothers who raise their children alone.

Within the Workshop, mothers who had not worked before with legal forms, had the opportunity to feel useful, appreciated, confident in their forces and collectively integrated. They have had the chance to develop essential skills such as responsibility, teamwork, respecting the rules related to a working environment, being punctual.

Through its social objectives such as: creating working places which are flexible and adjusted to the situation of a single parent, getting the necessary abilities to access the labour market and obtaining professional skills, the social enterprise contributes, in a significant way, to the raise of the impact in the lives of the beneficiaries and their children, in order to obtain an autonomy and the financial independence of the family, on a long term.

The mothers benefited from training in manufacturing textile toys held by a specialized tailoring instructor and meanwhile the children have developed educational activities together with the volunteers of the Association. Combining the social services (social, psychological and vocational counselling) with the activity of the enterprise have facilitated the socio-professional integration of the beneficiaries.

There have also been organized exhibitions with sales and interactive theatre shows within the kindergartens and schools with the aim to promote and sell the textile toys.



Generating incomes for the maintenance of the Workshop is another component of the social enterprise which resulted in obtaining the amount of 22632 lei, from selling the toys and the objects specially designed for holidays, made within the Workshop. The incomes are being used for covering the costs of the enterprise and for supporting the beneficiaries of the Association.

RESULTS

3 working places for single mothers who have been assured during the year in the social enterprise.

16 mothers who have benefited from the services offered in the social enterprise.

9 mothers who found a work place, following the received support.

2 mothers who benefited from the payment of professional qualification courses.

2289 products created in the workshop have been valued.



22 632 lei obtained through the selling of hand-made toys in the Workshop will be used to support other mothers in difficulty and to develop the enterprise.

30 exhibitions organized to promote and sell the products made in the Workshop.

7 companies have supported the Creation Workshop through buying our products: Kinstellar Business Services, SC Harom International SRL, Stoica & Asociatii SCA, Abbot Products SRL, BRD – Groupe Société Générale, SC Mega Image SRL, SC Tagiri Consulting SRL.

“I am 32 years old and I have two children aged 3. The father of the children left us only few days after I gave birth and went to live with another woman because it seemed hard to take care of the children and to maintain us. I remained alone, it was extremely difficult, I have even been advised to leave them in an orphanage and I didn't want to because they are my children and I wanted them. I have been in a desperate situation, I had nothing to give them to eat, I had nobody to leave them with so that I could work, I had no money to pay my bills and I had accumulated big delays in payments. Since I came to ACSIS Association I have been better. I have also joined the Workshop. Here I have learned to cut and to sew at the machine, I have met other mothers in my situation and I have started to feel less lonely. After a while I have been employed, I come every day at the Workshop and the best is that I can also take my children with me. Now I have my own money, I have paid most of my debts, ACSIS Association has also paid a qualification course for me, I have learned to make toys and brooches and I am glad that I can make such beautiful things. Now I would like to be able to work, in the future, in the tailoring field as well, because I see that it fits me and the tailoring instructor in charge of the Workshop always tells me that I am good at it”. *(Daniela, employer of the social enterprise)*

I KNOW HOW DIFFICULT IT IS TO BE ALONE, AMONG STRANGERS



“Here, at the Association, I have found a lot of understanding and support. During the summer holiday I always lose my jobs because I cannot leave the girls alone, but at ACSIS I can bring them with me. I have been living in an orphanage, I know how difficult it is to be alone, among strangers. There are evenings when we eat bread with butter and salt, but I don't abandon them. If I leave them, it means to insult them and to insult myself. I won't give up my children, no matter what!”, *says Dana, mother employed by the social enterprise.*

DO YOU LIKE CHOCOLATE?

Interactive theatre shows

We have organized 9 interactive theatre shows for the children in kindergartens, schools and for the children of the employers from different companies, sustained by two puppeteers who have given life to the toys hand made by the mothers within the Creation Workshop. More than 725 children have received, at the end of each show, a puppet toy.

The play is a story in which everything starts with a chocolate egg which needs to be protected by two birds, Lao and Mao (puppets made by the mothers) and which are cheated by a fox, cunning of course, who steals the egg. The children are encouraged to take part in the evolution of the events, to come up with solutions and ending is a happy one: the egg is retrieved and the children receive some learning regarding taking responsibility, respecting the given work and the importance of truth.

On the occasion of 1st June we have organized shows dedicated to children of the employers of BRD - Groupe Société Générale company: « It was an interactive theatre show in which the story changed according to the children's wish and which the parents loved. Our little children have enjoyed a special show, offered by a young and talented team and everything for a good cause» (Cristina Pavel, Social Responsibility Coordinator, BRD-Groupe Société Générale).

3. PROJECT - SOCIAL RIGHTS FOR MOTHER AND CHILD



657 mothers having 1003 children benefited from information and counseling regarding the social rights associated with the couple mother-child pair, the legal proceedings for obtaining these, existing social services.

We have had various activities of informing and counseling regarding the rights related to the couple mother-child pair within two maternity hospitals in Bucharest (Dr Panait Sarbu Maternity Hospital and Bucur Maternity Hospital) following the direct findings of the mothers' needs for counselling, immediately after giving birth, in relation to both the rights and the maternity pays offered by the government and the existing social services.

The decrease or the stopping for long periods of time of the social compensation are realities that the deprived families have struggled with during this year, in a social and economical context which has been extremely difficult due to the economic crisis.

At the same time, while working with these families, we have met situations in which the financial aid, no matter how small, meant a lot for a child, it meant the survival for one more day or one more week. That is why we strongly believe that the mothers who are in a high social risk should know their rights and benefit from this funding which can bring an increase in the family income and can maintain the hope of a possible future next to their children.



The activities of the project consisted in: social counselling and assistance in the process for obtaining the rights and the rightful social compensation, support in accessing the existing social services, spreading informative leaflets regarding the rights and social compensation.

4. PREVENTING HUMAN TRAFFICKING PROJECT




According to UNICEF data, 5,5 million children around the world are victims of human trafficking and are exploited without any mercy. The real proportions of this phenomenon remain in the shadow due to the invisible character of the victims and of the criminal networks that are involved.

Human trafficking is a phenomenon which, likewise that of children abandon, dissolves and destroys families, causes wounds which are difficult to imagine extremely difficult to heal. It affects especially the vulnerable young people and raising the awareness of the risks and the operating methods of the traffickers and the consequences of this illegal action help them defend and protect themselves.

Taking all these into account, we aimed at raising the self-defence capacity of the groups at risk through information and education activities and, at the same time, raising the awareness level of the community regarding this phenomenon through developing and running awareness campaigns in Bucharest.



The teachers have also been involved in discussions on current and interesting topics such as raising the level of awareness among the young people regarding human trafficking versus decreasing the perceived gravity of the phenomenon and fighting against the myths related to human trafficking and the evolution of the ways the victims are being recruited.



We have organized informative workshops addressed to pupils from 2 high-schools in Bucharest: The No. 3 Art and Craft School and "Fine Mechanics" Technological High-school. The workshops have been especially designed for the teenagers who participated and they have been encouraged to discuss topics such as: the main methods of recruiting the victims, the human trafficker profile, ways of transportation and exploitation of the victim based on gender and age categories, ways of preventing and social involvement in order to prevent the phenomenon.

After finishing the information activities we have organized for the pupils some thematic competitions of posters and essays, in which each pupil had the opportunity to express his/her point of view regarding the discussions which took place in the classroom concerning human trafficking, this time using their imagination and developing their creativity.

40 informed teachers regarding the ways of counseling young people about human trafficking prevention.

497 informed pupils concerning the risks and self defense methods when facing human trafficking.

40 informative brochures “Preventing human trafficking” disseminated by the teachers participating in the project.

497 informative brochures “Stop human trafficking” spread by to pupils participating in the project.

2 thematic competitions organized in the high-schools which have been partners in the project: The No.3 Art and Craft School and the “Fine Mechanics” Technological High-school.

20 pupils awarded for the most beautiful works within the 2 thematic competitions which have been organized: the awards consisted in mp4 players, school materials and sweets.

15 mothers in high social risk, were informed about the dangers, consequences and defense techniques against human trafficking phenomenon.

The thematic posters competition has offered us the opportunity to evaluate the results of our workshops translated into an artistic and creative form.

Therefore, the pupils have been challenged to express, through drawings, their thoughts and feelings that they had following the activities that we had organized in their classes. For over a week, teams made up of teachers and pupils, tried to capture the problem and the devastating effects of this phenomenon in some original posters.

EVENTS

Thematic Essays Competition within “Fine Mechanics” Technological High-School in Bucharest.

To the pupils enrolled at “Fine Mechanics” Technological High-school we have offered a different challenge, that of writing short thematic essays through which they could transmit a message to their colleagues in other high-schools. They have been encouraged to write their opinion on this phenomenon, to describe the cases they have heard about in mass media or from acquaintances and to provide examples of activities related to preventing human trafficking in which they would like to participate next to their teachers.



“I have learnt that I need to pay more attention to the people around me, to take care who do we hang around with, what we do and where. All the discussions have been useful; I will think 10 times before doing something. We are grateful because there are still people who want to prevent human trafficking!” - *the words of a pupil participating in the information session, 10th grade, “Fine Mechanics” Technological High-school.*

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“We are born, we grow and we step on the same ground, but much too indifferent. We hear many things, but we don't give them any importance. As we all know, the children sale has started to grow in Romania. The parents negotiate, promise and even apply. Many of the parents simply don't know what happens to their children after that. We all know these details, but we don't take any measure - and we are helpless or careless. And children keep on being sold” - *fragment of a winning essay, the author: A.S., 9th grade, “Fine Mechanics” Technological High-school.*

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I am grateful: the volunteering experience made me feel useful! Being a person who has enjoyed the unconditional support of the family at any stage of my life, I have always asked myself how can a mother overcome the critical moments of life alone, moments such as: losing her job, lacking a house, being abandoned by her partner, the physical abuses endured, the severe diseases.

I realised that the answer is solidarity, and that, only with the support of the community, the vulnerable mothers can surpass this hard period.

Working as volunteer, I had the opportunity to understand how an NGO is organized, to take part in the deployment of its projects and to know the work of the involved specialists (psychologists, social workers) closely. I became aware of the importance of specialized help, meant to respond to the concrete needs of the beneficiaries of the projects.

Volunteering helped me develop social and practical skills by participating in social investigations, fairs, group activities, information sessions.

I have felt a special nearness to the beneficiary mothers when I worked at the Creation Workshop, where I have personally met the mothers and from whom I have discovered that, for them, each day is a hard battle for survival. From all the projects developed by the Association, the Creative Workshop seemed to have a great practical utility. Besides offering a qualification in creating textile toys and ensuring a working place, this project manages to increase the mothers the self confidence and to give them a feeling of usefulness, so important for each of us, especially when we go through hard times.



I can say that I am one of the “beneficiaries” of ACSIS projects, reason for which I am deeply grateful: the volunteering experience made me feel useful and gain experience.

I have learned that the powerful person is not the one who reaches the highest social status but the one who, even though he/she has been through the storm of life, manages to keep on fighting without losing the hope for better.

The opportunity to become a volunteer for ACSIS came in a time when I needed to feel useful and to interact with new people. Therefore, I had the chance to meet the beneficiary mothers who were working at the Creation Workshop. I have known them better and I realized that for them the meetings at the Workshop were an opportunity for joy because in this way they could forget their daily worries and the problems which were overwhelming during the week.



I have also had the privilege to be involved in the “Preventing Human Trafficking” project which took place in high-schools with the aim at informing the groups at risk and the teachers. I have met informed young people and young people who wanted to learn as many details as possible. I learned how to address them, so that the message would be well received, stirring their interest and openness to the topic.

The social investigations made me face a reality that, before that moment, I was not aware of. I have met people who had to face difficult situations alone, which made me appreciate even more the support of those around me.

Within this volunteering, I learned two major things: it is more beautiful to give than to receive and how much a thanking smile for the given support matters.

I would like to thank ACSIS team for the warmth with which they have received me, for their trust and for the beautiful and useful experiences that I have lived during this period.


