**The VISION,** we actively strive to since 2004, is of a society that functions as a living organism, a body made up of diverse communities, each with its specific contribution in social life; communities acting jointly, educative and preventive for each of their members.

**Our MISSION** is sustainable development of family and community through education and specialized intervention for prevention of harmful social phenomena such as maternal abandonment, trafficking in persons or school dropouts. We achieve this through the development of education programs for a healthy life, psycho-social support, social and professional inclusion of vulnerable persons.

### **Our VALUES**

We deeply believe in **Solidarity** that we translate in all our projects, through implementation of pro-awareness activities, proactive prevention and action against situations of vulnerability of community members and by increasing social cohesion, as a consequence of these synergistic activities.

## WHAT DO WE DO?



## THE PARENT-CHILD COUNSELING AND SUPPORT CENTER -ACSIS

supports and assists the parents/potential parents in order to face with the psycho-social difficulties affecting the family relationships, in order to develop the parental competences, to prevent the child's separation from his family and supports the children when problems appear in their development.







# In 2019, the activities of the center mainly focused on:



Parents' counseling in order to surpass the cases of difficulty endangering the children's development or generating risks of the children's separation from their family environment,



Parents' counseling with respect to the factors endangering child's health, security, moral development, education and social integration,



Parents' information in order to cover the children's needs.



Support and counseling of the children with difficulties of development and/or integration into the family, school, social and community groups,



The consolidation of parents' abilities and knowledge with respect to the child's care and education.



Information and counseling of the vulnerable children and youth concerning the human trafficking, the risks and consequences of this phenomenon, the human rights.

## PREVENTING THE SEPARATION OF CHILDREN FROM THEIR FAMILIES

59 beneficiaries, single mothers and children



## Main activities:

- Assistance and support to obtain the social benefits from the authorities, support and accompaniment in order to access them, according to the laws in force;
- Accompaniment and support in the school and professional (re) integration;
- Social counseling in order to identify solutions for the problems putting the family at risk of child's separation;
- Support in formation and development of the abilities required for children's education and care, in mediation of the couple/family relationships, in the development of social competences;
- The parents' information in order to identify children's needs;
- Activities of information with respect to the phenomenon of trafficking in human beings.





### Individual and group counseling to achieve the following goals:

- Improvement of the dysfunctional interactions parent-child;
- Development of a parent-child positive attachment relationship;
- Improvement of the parent-child communication ways;
- Surpassing the risk situation of the child's separation from his family;
- Avoidance of the definitive alteration of the parent-child relationship;
- Amelioration of the psycho-social difficulties affecting family relationships;
- Surpassing the intra-family and inter-generation conflictive conditions;
- Parents' awareness with respect to the importance of school attendance of their own children and assurance of tools and guidelines in the process of children's education.
- Support in assuming responsibilities related to work and in the acquisition of skills required to obtain a workplace, acquire manual and professional abilities and skills within the creation workshop of the association.
- Assurance of the access to health services (inclusion at a family physician);
- Guidance and collaboration with other institutions/ NGO's that could support the families with additional services in solving the social problems;
- Monthly material/ financial support (food and hygienic products, clothes, customized support to cover some expenditure like the rent, the nursery/kindergarten) for a limited period of time, in order to surpass the case of difficulty.

### Main results:

- 17 children in difficulty/risk of separation from their family remained with their mothers and they benefit of appropriate care for their age and their needs, following to the support they received
- 10 single/disadvantaged mothers benefited of psycho-social counseling, vocational counseling, activities of support and parental education
- 12 groups of support and parental education were sustained for the mothers included in the project, approaching subjects of interest in the child's care and development, in order to improve the parental knowledge and skills (among the subjects approached, we remind: the parent-child attachment relationship, the children's needs, emotions and behaviour; Resilience. How we can contribute to the increase of children's resilience)
- 10 disadvantaged single mothers received monthly material and/or financial support to surpass the situation of difficulty
- 5 single mothers obtained and maintained a workplace and they live from their own resources, following to the sustained assistance of our team.
- 13 mothers with 19 children were guided to services appropriate to their needs (maternal center, social refectory, counseling centers for the victims of domestic violence)

#### **Testimonials:**

"I have suffered a lot in my whole life and one of the suffering sources was, paradoxically, the effort of concealing it. I have often felt myself like an actress playing a part in the exterior, for the people around me; I pretended all was right but only in my soul I knew how hard it was. I have always considered that requesting help is under my human dignity but, when I stayed in front of Mrs. Iulia from ACSIS, when she looked into my eyes and told me it was my right as human being to ask for help in case of need, then a change occurred in myself, like a trigger, and my thought seemed to have reset itself. I'm no longer ashamed to ask for help and to offer help myself when someone else needs it."

### PREVENTING TRAFFICKING IN PERSONS PROJECT

## 320 high school students, disadvantaged parents and children

#### Main activities:

During the school year 2018-2019, **24 students** from the Special Professional School 3 of Bucharest were trained by peer-to-peer education approach to transmit to their mates information related to trafficking in human beings and methods of self-protection against this phenomenon.

The peer-to-peer trainers delivered presentation sessions and moderated discussions about trafficking in human beings in classrooms, involving a number of **250 students**, mates of their school, with the support of the ACSIS representatives and their teachers.








A competition of drawings was also organized in which the pupils were invited to participate with thematic works, illustrating their opinion with respect to the phenomenon of the trafficking in human beings. The most beautiful 5 works were rewarded, and the most inspiring work was turned into a promoting poster of the peer-to-peer trainers activities within the school.

At the end of the presentation sessions, a rewarding ceremony dedicated to peer educators was organized, and their efforts were rewarded with prizes consisting of school materials, books and sweets, together with participation diplomas.











In September 2019, a collaboration protocol with the Technological High-School "Mircea Vulcănescu" was concluded in order to carry out the activities of the project in the school year 2019-2020.

**16 students** of this high-school were trained by the peer-to-peer education method to transmit to their mates information with respect to trafficking in human beings and methods of self-protection against this phenomenon. 10 training sessions for the peer educators were sustained and, next year, they will send the pieces of information further to their high-school mates.

**10 parents and 20 disadvantaged children** also participated in informative sessions with respect to the phenomenon of the trafficking in human beings.

This project is developed with financial and methodology support provided by Samilia Foundation – Belgium.

### **CREATIVE WORKSHOP PROJECT**



The purpose of this project is to empower disadvantaged single mothers by providing a learning, socializing, training and work frame adapted to their specific needs. We offer disadvantaged mothers an environment in which they gain confidence, feel responsible in a real manner toward what they are doing (because products are sold), and they learn how to do it (specifically textile toys manufacturing). Through this process, mothers gain skills that they can later apply in other posts in the labor market. We aim for financial autonomy and thereby the gain of necessary family resources to prevent child abandonment.

#### Main activities:

- Within group meetings with the support of a tailoring instructor, mothers learned to tailor, handicraft, and do manual work to create textile toys, small decorative objects, greeting cards, and other products.
- Concepts like punctuality, respect for co-workers, responsibility for the work done, respecting rules at a workplace, the importance and benefits of teamwork/working with others, and other workplace skills were constantly emphasized within group and individual meetings.



- We facilitated communication, connection, cooperation, friendship, experience sharing and mutual support among the mothers. We emphasized their contribution to support other mothers in need.
- We developed actions meant to attract the community support through volunteers who contributed either to the workshop activities or to the products' design, to the promotion materials or being present with the products at fairs, etc.
- We promoted and sold objects created by mothers through social networks, events, and fairs. The funds raised were used to support other disadvantaged single mothers.

### Main results:

- 5 single disadvantaged mothers participated in the creative activities,
- 10 organized meetings where mothers and volunteers learned how to create different products (textile toys, greeting cards, trinkets, small decorative objects),
- 4 volunteers were close to us within this project, participating together with the moms in the creation of different products,
- We participated with the products at 5 events in Bucharest: BountyFair Casa Universitarilor, the Charitable Fair organized by GfK, Charitable fairs organized within BRD Groupe Société Générale, the Fair "Vis de iarna" - Impact Hub Bucharest.

## ACCESS TO EDUCATION FOR DISADVANTAGED CHILDREN PROJECT



## 54 beneficiaries, children and parents

#### Main activities:

- Supporting the children in making their homework and activities of formation and development of the skills of writing, reading, language and arithmetic calculation;
- Entertainment and socializing activities, to enable the interpersonal relationships and the development of communication abilities, personal and social autonomy, formation and increase of the knowledge horizon and self-esteem, as well as informal entertaining activities like: walking in the park, going to the cinema;
- Organization of monthly sessions for parents (parents' school) in order to discuss the
  aspects of the children's evolution at school, the importance of education, motivation and
  offering tools and guidance in the process of their own children's education;
- Social counseling in order to solve and to improve the problems putting the family in risk of separation from the child or placing the child at risk of school dropout;
- Vocational counseling and guidance, support for the attendance of qualification courses/school, support in finding a job;
- Financial/material support (school materials, food, games, clothes, shoes, hygienic products) in order to surpass the situation of difficulty;



### **Results:**

- 25 pupils supported to be maintained at school and to have improved school results;
- 25 pupils recorded notable school progresses;
- No pupil abandoned the school;
- No pupil failed his class;
- 9 pre-school children supported in order to maintain them in family;
- All the supported children are attended by a family physician and enjoy of basic healthcare services;
- 20 parents in increased social risk benefited of social and vocational counseling;
- 20 parents participated in the monthly session of parents' school;
- 7 parents kept their workplace and 4 parents obtained a workplace with the support of the project team;
- 3 volunteers supported the project team during the year.

### **FUNDRAISING CAMPAIGN**

Following the campaign #highest grade mothers (#mamedenota10) deployed in August, ACSIS together with BONAMI, the online shop with furniture and decorations, raised the amount of lei 3425, used to purchase school materials for all the 25 children included in the counseling and support program of the organization.







This way, the Bonami clients could choose to purchase online virtual objects with different values: sharpeners, pencil cases, school bags representing donations. Bonami and ACSIS wished to draw attention on the school abandonment too, in Romania being the third largest one of Europe, according to Eurostat.

The school materials were offered at a meeting organized at the school where most of the children included in ACSIS programs learn. Both the children and the parents appreciated the gifts:

L., a little boy of 12 years, enthusiastically received the geometry case, as he has a passion for math. A mother who raises alone her three children, told us: "The children learn very well, especially R., the middle one. He has also received a prize this year. I try to assure all they need, but it is very difficult now, as I have not had a job since two months. Thank you very much for your help ".
