#### **FOREWORD**

We turn again and again to the starfishes' story whenever we feel we can do too little for those who turn to us, when we feel overwhelmed by the multitude of pressures that single mothers face in the struggle to keep their children, whenever the number of those who ask us for help exceeds our resources and powers to intervene. And this year, marked by the health crisis, major changes in all areas of our lives, of all of us, we had moments of discouragement, insecurity that led us to return to this story and to understand that we cannot do everything for all who come to us, but we can do as much as possible for the few, and we can inspire other good people to join us. And so we did, we went to the community and the positive answers came and people with big hearts did not hesitate to lend a helping hand.



The pandemic period, dominated by uncertainties and fear, hit hard on the families already living in poverty, and for the families consisting of mother and child/children it brought situations to the limit of survival. This year we have seen an increase in the number of requests for support, women who have approached us at the limit of their powers, in situations that could not have been foreseen, such as the death of a husband, loss or suspension of employment, the impossibility to provide food and all the necessary for the children.

The closure of the educational institutions has made many of them unable to find a job or work, having to supervise their children at home and having no one to entrust their care to.

We have managed this year to improve the lives of 488 children and 59 disadvantaged adults, to continue to offer social counseling services, psychological counseling, support in socio-professional integration/reintegration, material and financial support, counseling on self-protection methods against the phenomenon of human trafficking. In the most difficult situations, we have collaborated with other organizations and institutions to cover the needs of families, trying to create a support network around them, to help them regain hope and confidence in a better future with their children and to prevent the separation of children from their families.

We thank with full hearts of gratitude and appreciation to all those who joined our efforts this year as well: donors, funders, sponsors, collaborators, volunteers, who made our projects possible!


We cherish and manifest Responsibility in our projects: ours, as an organization, toward results of our projects and interventions;

supports and assists parents/potential parents to deal with psychosocial difficulties affecting family relationships, to develop parenting skills, to prevent the separation of the child from his family, and to support children when problems arise in their development.

#### 141 beneficiaries, children and single mothers

One thousand children are abandoned by their mothers, annually, in Romanian hospitals, lately. The health and economic crisis has exacerbated the problems that disadvantaged families face, leading to an increase in the number of those who cannot raise and care for their children and who are forced to entrust them to the state. The project is aimed to provide social, psychological and economical support to disadvantaged single mothers in Bucharest and surrounding areas, in order to prevent children abandonment.







#### Main activities:

- Social counseling in order to solve and improve the problems that put the family at risk of separation from the child
- Counseling and emotional support aimed at: developing a positive parent-child attachment relationship, improving parent-child communication methods; learning healthy behaviors and practices for raising and caring for the child; improving the emotional state, increasing the self-esteem, self-confidence, developing the skills to solve life problems
- Support in formation and development of the necessary skills for the children care and education, in mediation of the family relations, in development of the social skills
- Accompaniment and support in school and professional (re)integration
- Assistance and support for obtaining social benefits from the authorities, support and accompaniment in order to access them
- · Health education and facilitating access to health services
- Counseling aimed at making mothers responsible for the importance of educating their children and providing tools and guidance in the process of educating children;
- Monthly material support (food and hygiene products, supplies, clothing), individualized financial support to cover costs such as rent, utilities, for a limited period of time, in order to overcome the difficult situation

#### Main results:

- 36 children in difficulty/risk of family separation remained with their mothers and were taken care of
  appropriate to their age and needs, as result of the received support. 25 of them benefited from psychosocial
  assistance and monthly material/financial support, and 11 children were punctually supported, depending on
  the identified needs.
- 21 disadvantaged single mothers benefited from psycho-social counseling services, support activities and parental education, material support (food, hygiene products, clothing) and/or financial support to overcome the difficult situation.
- 25 children were assisted with school supplies, school articles, tablets, in order to prevent school dropout
- 6 beneficiary mothers have obtained and kept a job and support themselves from their own resources, as a result of the sustained assistance of our team
- 38 mothers with 46 children benefited from counseling and guidance to services for their needs (maternal center, counseling centers for victims of domestic violence, social canteen)

During the emergency state, when the Center was closed, we provided remotely counseling, information and emotional support, by phone and online. We have also intensified efforts to provide basic food and hygiene products to beneficiary mothers, financial support in order to cover rent costs and avoid evictions, costs associated with home maintenance and utilities







With the support of the U.S. Embassy in Romania, between October 2020 and March 2021, we carry out activities aimed at the socio-professional integration of single mothers, through:

- Monthly sessions on the labor market (how to access the right job offer, support for finding a job: hands-on sessions on writing a CV, preparation for a job interview, guidance towards vacant jobs, labor legislation information, support for identifying and following qualification courses)
- · Support in acquiring basic tailoring and craft skills within the creative workshop of the association
- Mentoring activities: mediation of mutual relations and solidarity between mothers who have overcome difficult life situations with the support of the association and mothers who are going through similar situations at present

#### Main results:


- 10 beneficiary mothers acquired skills necessary to access a job, were assisted in a CV drafting and in finding a job
- 3 workshops to present the labor market, support in acquiring skills needed to access a job, in CV drafting, were held near the end of the year, in small groups, respecting protection from Covid-19 measures
- 3 training hands-on practical sessions in which mothers learned basic tailoring and craft skills, how to make textile toys, small decorative objects, cards, aprons and others. Skill building was combined with knowledge and habit formation: punctuality, respect for co-workers, responsibility for the work done, respecting rules at a workplace, teamwork.
- 4 mothers were involved in mentoring activities mothers who benefited from our support and

## THE CAMPAIGN "12 MOTHERS WHO RAISE ALONE THEIR OWN CHILDREN NEED HELP

In April, during the beginning of the pandemic, we launched a call for support for single mothers integrated in the program of the Center of Counseling and Support for Parents and Children, who were in extremely difficult life situations, in isolation, facing with hard difficulties in providing food and care for children, difficulties in covering the costs associated with rent, utilities.





At the beginning of the pandemic, I was announced that I would be evicted from the house where I was renting, together with the 3 children I raise alone. I hadn't been able to pay the last few months and they clearly told me that I had to leave. The news came at a time when we were already terrified of what was happening, with the emergency state and what followed. The commitments I had to do housekeeping for few families in the neighborhood were no longer valid during the quarantine, I could not go and we lost the only money from which we could support ourselves. I asked ACSIS for help and they helped me pay the rent and not go out on the street with the children, they sent us food, they helped me get through a very difficult time for me and the children.

#### PREVENTING HUMAN TRAFFICKING PROJECT

#### 447 beneficiaries, high school students, parents, children

#### Main activities:

During the school year 2019-2020, 16 students from the "Mircea Vulcanescu" Technological High School Bucharest were trained through the method of peer to peer education to transmit to their colleagues information on human trafficking and ways of self-protection against this phenomenon. Peer educators held presentation sessions and moderated discussions in classroom about human trafficking, involving 390 students, colleagues from their school, with the support of ACSIS representatives and teachers.

A drawing competition was also organized, where students were invited to participate with thematic works, illustrating their opinion on the phenomenon of human trafficking. The most inspired work was transformed into a poster promoting the activities of peer to peer educators in the school. The closure of schools at the beginning of March, due to the health crisis, determined us to prematurely end the project and to reschedule some of the activities.





#### PREVENTING HUMAN TRAFFICKING PROJECT

During and immediately after the emergency state, given the signals regarding the exposure of children to an increased risk of abuse, neglect, exploitation and violence, on the ground of intensified isolation measures in the context of Covid19, we initiated, with the support of Samilia Foundation, actions designed to prevent situations that endanger safety and increase the risk of exploitation of disadvantaged children and single mothers integrated into our projects.





14 disadvantaged single mothers and their 27 children received counseling and information on: online safety rules for children, the importance of supervising children's online activities in an age-appropriate manner, safety measures and parental control; counseling in order to create, strengthen a positive relationship with children, based on communication, respect and mutual trust; information on methods and strategies of positive discipline, educational and recreational activities, healthy alternatives to spending time in front of the TV or the screen with online games; emotional support in order to overcome the states of helplessness, uncertainty, anxiety, depression, felt acutely during the period of isolation, by offering ways and techniques to manage emotions, increase the resilience of both beneficiary mothers and their children.

#### **CREATIVE WORKSHOP PROJECT**

The aim of the project is to provide a framework for learning, socializing and acquiring work skills, organized and adapted to mothers in social difficulty, who raise their children alone.

Single disadvantaged mothers encounter many difficulties such as lack of support from their partners or families in raising their children, prejudices and rejection from the community, lack of income, emotional overload, and often depression and anxiety regarding the future. These difficulties can lead to behaviors of social isolation and learned helplessness that we have witnessed over and over in our more than 16 years of working with this population. We provided a safe framework for them to overcome the pattern of isolation, to receive the support of other women in similar situations, receive the support of community, and have the opportunity of meaningful work of contributing and creating while learning basic skills in tailoring and manufacturing.

5 volunteers joined the project activities, in an open atmosphere, favorable to the exchange of experiences and communication, solidarity and contribution, sending mothers the message that they have community support, that they have a support network on which they can rely on, that they are not isolated and forced to rely only on their own strength in the fight for a better future for themselves and for their children.







#### **CREATIVE WORKSHOP PROJECT**

#### Main results:

- 10 single mothers being in high social risk participated in the workshop activities
- 12 organized meetings, during which mothers and volunteers learned to make different products: greeting cards, textile toys, March trinkets, ornaments and decorative objects associated with the winter holidays
- 400 products were created during the activities, with the support of a tailoring instructor
- 5 volunteers were with us in this project, participating along mothers in creating various products
- The products were promoted online, but also in various events: March trinket charity fairs, organized by BRD Groupe Societe Generale and KPMG Romania, online Christmas charity fairs dedicated to employees organized by the same companies, exhibitions for sale at the headquarters of the association's collaborators
- The raised funds were used to support single beneficiary mothers (material support consisting of food, hygiene and financial support to cover the urgent needs of the families)


